Certificates of Commendation Presented to Auxiliary Members

Mr. L. Humphries, Regional Director, Canadian Coast Guard, Newfoundland Region, presented Certificates of Commendation to auxiliarists Wilfred Bartlett and David Hann at a gathering on board CCGS Franklin on Wednesday, December 10, 1980.

The certificates, which originated from the office of the Commissioner, Canadian Coast Guard, were awarded to the two auxiliarists for the role played in the dramatic rescue of the crewmembers of the Portuguese Trawler, Maria Teixiera Vilarinho, which grounded on a reef near Black Tiokle, Labrador, on September 4 of this year.

In his address Mr. Humphries referred to the Auxiliary "having come of age" in this Region and that this rescue highlighted the efforts of auxiliarists "not only in this Region but across the country". "The greatest single advantage of the Auxiliary in this Region" he went on to say "was the factor of local knowledge, so vital in Search and Rescue activity." This together with the skilled seamanship demonstrated, resulted in the saving of many lives on that day.

Dramatic rescue on Labrador Coast____

On Thursday, September 4th. at 06372, the Portuguese trawler, "Maria Teixeira Vilarinho" issued a MAYDAY call in position 5327N., 5546W. (Black Tickle, Labrador). The vessel had been collecting frozen fish from fishermen in the area and apparently had weighed anchor with a heavy gale coming up when she lost power and was driven into a reef in the area known locally as "Salmon Bight".

The ship was solidly grounded with the wind and seas on her stern. Winds at the time of the grounding were estimated between 70 to 75 knots from the NNE and local seas were estimated to be 15 feet high. At daylight, longliners in the area tried but could not get closer than 400 yards to the stricken vessel, which at times was completely covered with breaking seas. Local longliners involved in going to the stricken vessel included the "Blue Charm", "Northern Transport", "Arctic Venture", "Omega II" and two Canadian Marine Rescue Auxiliary vessels, the "Lori and Paula", owned by David Hann of Trout River and the "Nancy Bartlett", owned by Wilf Bartlett of Brighton, Notre Dame Bav.

Reports indicate that an attempt to abandon ship was made as early as 0730L, but the crewmen had to get back on board the stricken trawler due to the fact that the longliners could not get close enough to pick up the lifeboats or rafts.

Winds reduced to 50-55 knots around noon and shortly afterwards, crewmembers again began abandoning the ship and were picked up by the fishermen who approached the grounded vessel with the assistance of oil being pumped on the water from the coastal tanker, "Tana Woodward". Another vessel, the coastal trader, M/V, "Kloster", was also in Black Tickle at the time of this incident and was a vital communications link between the Coast Guard Radio Stations, SAREC and the distressed vessel.

CMRA member, David Hann, because of radio communications on his longliner, acted as the communication co-ordinator for the rescue. Thirty-five people were rescued by the other five boats and brought to shore, including twelve by the CMRA vessel, "Nancy Bartlett". At 1430L, Rescue 301 from 103 Rescue Unit, Gander, arrived on scene and completed the evacuation of the remaining twentynine crewmembers. The evacuation

was completed at 1553L.

This daring and successful rescue is the first time that CMRA members have been involved in such a major rescue effort. The manner in which it was effected, the risk to which they subjected themselves and their vessels, and the seamanship qualities exhibited, speak highly of the services that CMRA members and fishermen, in general, in the Newfoundland Region can provide to assist in incidents of this nature.

Black Tickle is a community with a population of 200 people. However, fishermen from the island portion of the Province use it as a port to land and process fish during the summer months

Association Nursing Station has a clinic there which treated three or four people suffering from shock and exposure, and the RC School offered its facility to shelter rescued crewmembers for the night.

Despite low supplies of food, clothing, etc. in the community, the local inhabitants spared nothing in providing same to rescuees.

The SAR Division of the Canadian Coast Guard, Newfoundland Region, commends the combined work of Rescue 301, CMRA volunteers, local fishermen and inhabitants of Black Tickle, in effecting a successful rescue and fully appreciates the efforts made by all in preventing what could have become a tragedy in a remote and inaccessible part of the Province.

Auxiliary Holds Second Annual Meeting

The Canadian Marine Rescue Auxiliary (Nfld) Incorporated held its second annual meeting in Springdale, on November 22-23, 1980. Present for the meeting were Captain Peter Troake, President; Harry Strong, 1st Vice-President; Secretary Treasurer Dr. Bob Lucas, elected representatives Captain James Batt, Ken Lane, David Hann, and Herb Pittman.

Due to committments beyond their control, two other representatives could not attend. Mr. James Carmier, Auxiliary Co-ordinator for Maritimes Region was present as an observer.

Representing the Canadian Coast Guard were Ed Stack, Auxiliary Coordinator, Nfld. Region and Bernard Leonard, Coast Guard Rescue Officer.

The meeting had reports from incidents and activities of the past year, highlighted by the Auxiliary environment in the Black Tickle Incident in September.

Items raised for discussion by the Auxiliarists included a new contract for insurance, the recruiting of new members, the National Advisory Committee on CMRA, Incident reporting and re-imbursement and tasking procedures.

Captain Troake drew the meeting's attention to recent incidents which could be described as adventurism on the high seas and their tragic consequences. Apart from the almost suicidal activities going unchecked, Captain Troake reminded the meeting that such individuals could cause SAR resources to be diverted from providing a service to those who have a legitimate business on the sea.

As a result, a motion by Captain Jim Batt, seconded by Auxilarist David Hann, "to condemn adventurism on the high seas by inexperienced and illequipped individuals on the grounds that it often diverts SAR resources that might better be employed in the interests of those legitimately earning their living on the sea" was passed with unanimous approval.

At the Election of Officers for the coming year, Captain P. Troake was reelected for his third term as President. Harry Strong returned as 1st Vice-President, Captain J. Batt was elected as 2nd Vice-President and Dr. C.R. Lucas was re-elected as Secretary Treasurer.
