#### GROUNDING OF THE F/V VALERIE & BROTHERS II

n March 18, 2000 the Maritime Rescue Sub Centre (MRSC) in St. John's received notification, through the Placentia Marine Communications and Traffic Services (MCTS), that the fishing vessel Valerie & Brothers II was aground in Wreck Cove, Fortune Bay with four people on board. The vessel went aground due to engine failure shortly after breaking her mooring during a storm.

Three occupants of the Valerie & Brothers II managed to reach shore and take shelter in a nearby cabin. The fourth individual sustained injuries in his effort to save the boat and was unable to climb the slippery rocks to safety forcing him to remain with the stricken vessel. At this time the weather was reported to be Northeast winds, 35 to 45 knots, heavy seas, with reduced visibility in heavy snow and freezing spray.

In addition to tasking several primary Search and Rescue (SAR) air and maritime resources and two vessels of opportunity, three Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (CCGA) vessels were tasked. After approximately one hour on task, the CCGA Jane and Brothers stood down due to the severe ice accumulation on the vessel. The other two CCGA vessels, Trina & Sons and Stephen & Jayde, being larger vessels, were able to press on through the storm and arrive at the scene.

Following a quick assessment of the scene by the Auxiliary members, a small life-boat was floated to evacuate the injured man. By this time the injured man was unable to walk or help himself due to his injuries and the effects of hypothermia. Once onboard the larger vessel, the injured man was treated for hypothermia and evacuated to hospital in Harbour Breton. The patient had spent a total

of five hours in the water and, in his opinion and the opinion of the receiving physician, was very near death at the time of his rescue.

The other three crew members remained at the cabin in Wreck Cove until the weather was favourable for them to return home.

Roger Slaney, the Marine Communications and Traffic Services (MCTS) officer, was at the radio position in Placentia and heard the very weak distress call on Channel 16. The detecting of this initial call and follow-up calls determined an emergency (grounding) had occurred. The high level of skill shown by the MCTS officer in detecting the initial call and obtaining essential information in very terrible radio conditions resulted in the successful rescue of the stranded crew member.

This Search and Rescue mission incident lasted 6 ½ hours from start to finish. Due to the bravery, skill and dedication of the 8 CCGA members, two Auxiliary vessel crewmembers and the CCG employee this case ended successfully.

#### CANADIAN COAST GUARD COMMISSIONER'S COMMENDATION

For their valour and bravery shown by their life saving efforts during this Search and Rescue incident, eight members of the CCGA (N) Inc. from Harbour Breton and two Auxiliary vessel crewmembers received the Canadian Coast Cuard Commissioner's Commendation at an Awards Ceremony held at the Lion's Club in Harbour Breton.



#### DID YOU KNOW???

## Cellular Telephone Service – (\*16) Marine Emergencies

arine Communications and Traffic Services Centres in certain parts of Canada are connected to the Cellular Telephone network system. Cellular telephone users can, in an emergency situation, dial \*16 on their telephone to access an MCTS centre in order to obtain assistance. Details of this service may be obtained by contacting the local Cellular telephone company.

Mariners are cautioned that the maritime mobile radio safety system in the southern waters of Canada is based principally on VHF communications. VHF has the advantage that a call can be heard by the closest MCTS Centre (s) and by ships in the vicinity which could provide immediate assistance. On the other hand, the cellular telephone network is a party-to-party system and the benefit of the broadcast mode in an emergency situation cannot be obtained.

Mariners are reminded that the use of a radiotelephone set to obtain assistance in an emergency situation is the best option and that cellular telephone should be used only as an alternative should the VHF radiotelephone set not be available. Standard distress alerting equipment, such as radiotelephone and EPIRBS should never be replaced by cellular telephone alone.

Please note that in the Newfoundland Region, \*16 emergency service is available in the island portion of the province where cellular coverage exists. This service is not currently available in Labrador. All \*16 calls received are routed to St. John's MCTS centre for action.
